#### **ECFMG®'s Role in US Health Care**

- Private, non-profit, non-governmental organization committed to promoting excellence in international medical education
- Formally incorporated as an independent organization in 1956
- Responsible for establishing International Medical Graduates' (IMGs') eligibility to take examinations
- Responsible for certifying IMGs readiness to enter postgraduate medical education programs



#### **ECFMG's Mission**

"The ECFMG promotes quality health care for the public by certifying international medical graduates for entry into U.S. graduate medical education, and by participating in the evaluation and certification of other physicians and health care professionals. In conjunction with the Foundation for Advancement of Medical Education and Research (FAIMER®), and other partners, it actively seeks opportunities to promote international medical education and research through programmatic and research activities."

#### **ECFMG Certification Requirements**

- Must be an 'International Medical Graduate'
  - Medical school located outside the US or Canada
- Pass a series of examinations
  - USMLE<sup>TM</sup> Step 1, Step 2 CK, Step 2 CS
  - Verification of medical education credentials
  - Medical school listed in IMED
    - Valid graduation year
    - 4 credit (academic) years
- Must be certified to:
  - Enter accredited US postgraduate medical education programs
  - Apply to take USMLE Step 3
  - Apply for licensure in all US jurisdictions

#### **Definitions**

- Examinations
  - USMLE™ Step 1: Basic Science
  - USMLE<sup>TM</sup> Step 2 CK: Clinical Science Knowledge
  - Clinical Skills: Standardized Patient Examination
- ECFMG Applicants
  - Registered for examinations required for certification between 1993 and 2007
- ECFMG Certificate Holders
  - Met all certification requirements
- Delineation of the European Region
  - 47 'member states' as defined by the Council of Europe
  - Eligible for participation in the Bologna Process
  - 41 member states with medical schools listed in IMED

- ECFMG Application & Certification databases
  - Demographics & examination performance of medical school students and graduates
- FAIMER International Medical Education Directory
  - Characteristics of medical schools


# Demographics: ECFMG Applicants & Certificate Holders 1993-2007





# ECFMG Initial Applicants 1993-2007 by Location of Medical School




# ECFMG Initial Applicants 1993-2007: Number from European Medical Schools





# ECFMG Applicants from European Medical Schools by Application Year





# **Basic Science (USMLE Step 1) First Attempt Pass Rates by Exam Year**








# Clinical Skills (CSA & Step 2CS) First Attempt Pass Rates by Exam Year







# ECFMG Certification Success by Initial Application Year, Country of Medical School, & Citizenship





Selected Group Comparisons




# First attempt Basic Science (USMLE Step 1) Pass Rates: Country Level Example






# First attempt Clinical Knowledge (USMLE Step 2): Country Level Example

#### **Concluding Remarks**

- Certification process in United States
  - Various assessment instruments
  - Verification of credentials (diploma, transcript)
  - Ensures common standards and assessment for all physicians
- Self-selected cohort of European medical school students/graduates
  - Only those applying to ECFMG for certification
  - Variation in pass rates could be due to individual differences in medical education and/or individual characteristics of medical school graduates



#### **Future Directions**

- Coordination of additional research
  - Determine to what extent ECFMG data is representative of all students
  - Examine characteristics of medical schools
  - Develop resources on undergraduate and postgraduate medical education
